



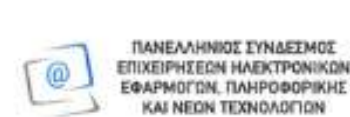

- More environmentally friendly than paper-based systems

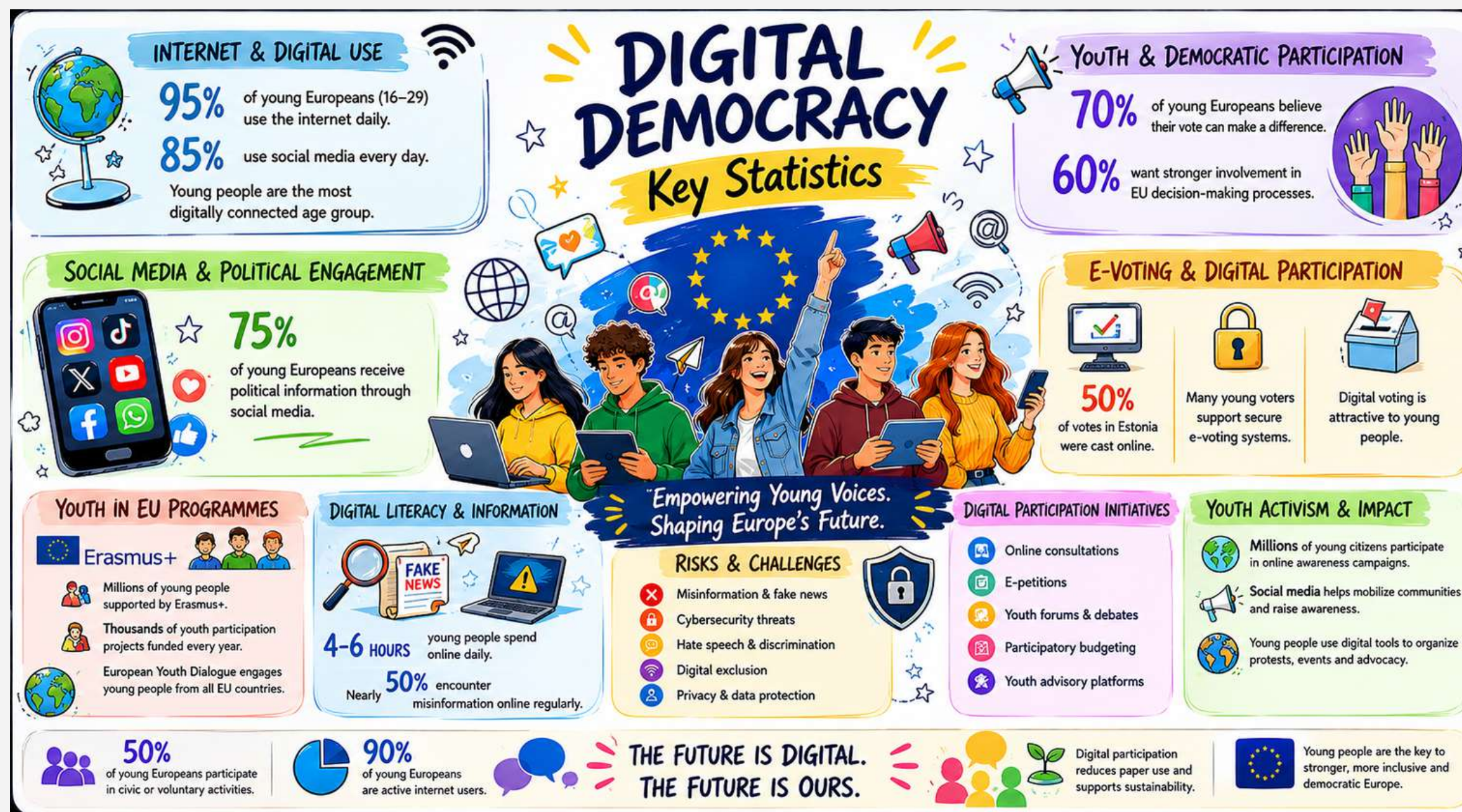


GROWTH OF INTERNET AND DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY USE

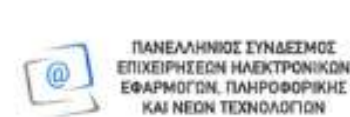
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
