



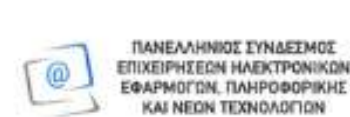

- Adaptability to different audiences



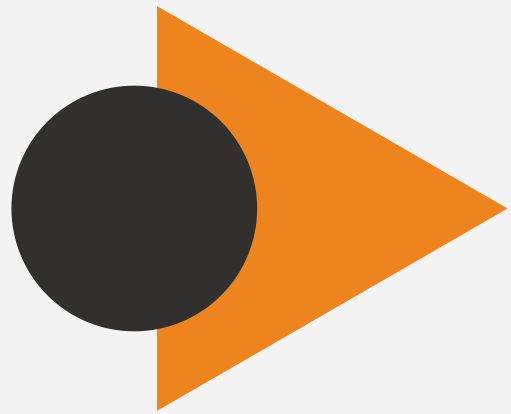
SOCIAL MEDIA AS A TOOL FOR CIVIC IMPACT

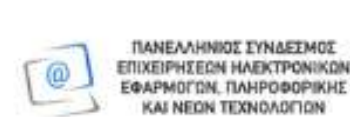
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
